

## 2010 POAC OFFICIAL SUPPLEMENT

Rule 18 (Page 41) A. Snowflake is a pattern of small spots scattered throughout the base color hair coat. One or two small spots do not make up a snowflake. Snowflakes must be visible at 40 feet. Mottling must be present and also must have either sclera and/or striped hooves. This rule applies to all ponies registered after 12/31/2009.

Rule 18 (Page 41) B. Frost is a pattern of giving the appearance of being lightly frosted over the back, loin and croup. It is definite white hairs mixed into the base coat. Frost must be visible at 40 feet. Mottling must be present and also must have either sclera and/or striped hooves. Rule applies to all ponies registered after 12/31/09.

Rule 18 (Page 41) F. Marbleized Roan Pattern—basic roan body color (including neck). A mixture of light and dark hairs with light color predominant and with “vanish” marks. Add: Mottling must be present and also must have either sclera and/or striped hooves. Rule applies to all ponies registered after 12/31/2009.

Rule 18 (Page 41) H. Roan- After “May have varnish marks”, change to read: Mottling must be present and also must have either sclera and/or striped hooves. Rule applies to all ponies registered after 12/31/09.

Rule 19 (Page 42) Add: White sclera is the same color as the white sclera of a person’s eye, true white as a true white sheet of paper.

Rule 20 (Page 43) J. Grays are usually born solid and begin to start graying out with each shedding of the coat. Color gray is not a patterning but only a base color. Gray must have a pattern in addition to the base coat.

Rule 20 (Page 43) K. True Red/Blue/Bay roans are generally born roan but some do roan out in other places besides their head and legs with first shedding. These roans do not roan all the way out to white. Red/Blue/Bay Roan is not a patterning but only a base color. These colors must have a pattern in addition to their base color.

Rule 25 (Page 48) E.5. Can be used for breeding (mares and stallions with a verifiable ApHC documented registration papers) showing at approved POAC shows, selling at POAC sales and qualify for any award. Send to POAC a copy of the registration papers.

Rule 29 (Page 50) A.1. Add: h. The POAC National Board of Directors will approve all National Inspectors.

### 43. PERMANENT HEIGHT CARD - "PHC" (Page 55)

Permanently registered POAs 46" to 56" are eligible to be measured for a Permanent Height Card. This card can be issued only by the Executive Secretary or a representative duly appointed by him. The Executive Secretary will not participate in the actual measurement process.

- A. The Executive Secretary or President shall name a committee of three, when the minimum required committee is present. A minimum of one National Director, one former Director and one National Inspector will be set up only at Regional Shows and Sales, the International Show, the Classic

Shows, and the International Sale to measure ponies whose owners have applied for a Permanent Height Card.

- B.** All ponies presented for permanent height card must have all paperwork and fees at the time of presenting the pony for measurement (original registration paper and two current pictures showing both sides, along with \$25 fee).
- C.** The POA shall first be found to be not under 46" and not over 56".
  1. Then, the height of the heel shall be determined by measuring from the skin line on the lower side of the coronary band to the ground, including shoe, if shod, with a six inch steel ruler perpendicular to the ground. (See illustration).
  2. The length of the toe of the same hoof shall then be determined by measuring the front of the hoof in the center from the skin line on the lower side of the coronary to the ground, including shoe if shod. (See illustration).
  3. The height of the shoe shall also be measured. This measurement, plus that of the heel and toe, shall be put on the POA's permanent papers, and a card issued to the owner.
  4. The shoe shall be measured with the foot on the ground at the toe and heel of the foot. These two measurements shall then be averaged for the recorded height of the shoe.
- D.** Ponies are to be measured by at least two of the measuring team with a 15 minute time limit each. The results of both measurers shall also be averaged for the ultimate height of the pony. The third member of the team shall observe all measuring to ascertain the accuracy of the measuring. He may participate by acting as scribe or by measuring the foot. Measuring the foot may be done by any member of the team.
- E.** In recording for PHCs, all measurements include the height of the shoe. Any shoe less than a full shoe must be removed before measuring, and no toe shoes, tapered shoes or recessed shoes will be allowed.
- F.** The PHC application form will expire sixty (60) days after date of being issued.
- G.** Ponies are not to be measured upon presentation of a Permanent Height Card at all POAC activities. Better wording: "Ponies with a Permanent Height Card do not have to be measured at any POAC activity."

Rule 53 (Page 59) A. 1. Shows for State Clubs/Chapters, or Regional Clubs will not be approved by the POAC office unless a slate of current officers is on file in the office. All officers must be current members of the POAC at the time the show approval is submitted.

Rule 54 (Page 60) A.2. A 75/25 ratio with a minimum of 5 games. The National Show Secretary is to count events (not classes) for show bill ratios. (example: Western Pleasure (age groups), Jr. Western Pleasure, Senior Western Pleasure, 8 & Under W/T Western Pleasure and 8 & Under 3-gait Western Pleasure is one event).

Rule 57 (Page 60) A. Add: Regional Clubs are limited to two (2) Ponyrama shows per year.

Rule 59 (Page 61) A. Add: Regional Clubs are limited to two (2) Building and Promotion Shows per year.

Rule 60 (Page 61) Add: Regional Clubs will be allowed two (2) IBC Shows per year.

Rule 66 (Page 64) J. High point and reserve awards will be given in each youth age division and may be divided by boy and girl. High point and reserve awards will be given in JPFC and 19 & Over.

Rule 67 (Page 67) N. 9. Delete High Point Junior Rail Pony Award

Rule 79 (Page 75) A.1.b. Adults – 19 years and older as of January 1 of the current year

(1) May only show in any approved 19 & Over Classes, including halter, in-hand trail, longe line, all approved JPFC, driving and most colorful.

Rule 81 (Page 76) New Paragraph B. The registered owner or owners are entitled to appeal the surrender of tentative registration papers within thirty (30) days after written notification with a \$100 appeal fee. The fee will be returned if overturned on appeal. Upon receipt of a Notice of Appeal and the appeal fee, the Executive Committee can make arrangements for inspection for overheight at next scheduled Board meeting by three (3) Board members. Their decision will be final.

Rule 84 (Page 77) Remove from the second sentence: "to be registered or".

Rule 84 (Page 78) New Paragraph H. The registered owner or owners are entitled to appeal the surrender of tentative registration papers within thirty (30) days after written notification with a \$100 appeal fee. The fee will be returned if overturned on appeal. Upon receipt of a Notice of Appeal and the appeal fee, the Executive Committee can make arrangements for inspection for lack of color and characteristics at next scheduled Board meeting by three (3) Board Members. Their decision will be final.

Rule 100 (Page 88) D.1. A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his pony (that has not fallen) in such a way as to necessitate remounting or vaulting into the saddle, except in gymkhana before or after the finish line.

Rule 104 (Page 93) M. 5 Protective boots, leg wraps and bandages are prohibited in Hunter Hack.

Rule 104 (Page 93) L.7. Protective boots, leg wraps and bandages are allowed in Open Jumping, Equitation Over Fences, and Hunter Over Fences.

Rule 144 (Page 159) C. Add 6: Nick Litzel/Art Schonfeldt Memorial Traveling Trophy sponsored by Katzenbergers J-N Farm is presented to the High Point Stallion in halter, all ages.

Rule 144 (Page 160) D. 1. Remove "8 & Under Walk-Trot Western Pleasure and Hunter Under Saddle."

Rule 144 (Page 160) D. 4. 8 & Under Walk/Trot Western Pleasure and Hunter Under Saddle.  
Renummer rest of paragraphs.

Rule 146 (2009 POAC Official Supplement) POAC HALL OF FAME

Make first paragraph "A"

B. Chair shall serve no more than five (5) years, and may not serve concurrent terms. The Hall of Fame Committee will elect its Chair by ballot every five (5) years beginning in 2014 for the term of the Chair beginning in 2015 to 2019. The Chair must be a member of the HOF Committee. In event of death or departure of the Chair, a new Chair will be elected by the Hall of Fame Committee members to complete said term. The nomination and balloting process shall be determined by the HOF Committee.

C. Any future additions to the HOF Committee, they must be voted on by the HOF Committee in position at that time.

Rule 161. Paragraph A. 1. Remove the word Tentatively. It now reads: "Pleasure Driving Futurity is open to any registered POA five (5) year old and under."

Rule 162 (Page 171) Paragraph F. 1. Second sentence, remove the word “Tentatively”. The sentence now reads: “The foal must be registered, with one parent a POA or registered POA breeding stock.”

Rule 165, Paragraph A. 1. Remove the word “tentative”. The sentence now reads: “These classes are open to registered yearling and two year old POAs.”

Rule 165 (page 175) A. 7. Ponies nominated for the Two-Year-Old Longe Line Futurity may NOT be nominated for the 18 & Under Futurities.

- a. May nominate and make payments for both the JPFC riding futurities and Longe Line Futurity until the September payment when a decision to ride or longe. NO refund of prior payments and all payments go to the appropriate class fund.
- b. A pony may be longed or ridden, but not both at any one show.

Rule 166 (Page 180) A. a. Remove the word “tentative”. The sentence now reads: “These classes are open to registered yearling and two year old POAs.”

Rule 166. (Page 180) A. 6. Ponies nominated for the Two Year Old In-Hand Trail class may NOT be nominated for the 19 & Over Reining.

- a. May nominate and make payments for both the JPFC trail and In-Hand Trail until the September payment when a decision to ride or in-hand. NO refund of prior payments and all payments go to the appropriate class fund.

Rule 167 (page 183) B. 5. Any pony nominated for the JPFC, may also be nominated for the Pleasure Driving and 19 & Over Reining Futurity and the Halter Futurities.
